

Fund Monthly Report

Important note:

- 1. BEA Union Investment Asian Strategic Bond Fund (the "Fund") seeks medium to long term capital growth and regular income by primarily (i.e. at least 70% of its non-cash assets) investing in debt securities that are (a) denominated in Asian currencies, or (b) issued or guaranteed by Asian governments or entities which are incorporated in Asia or have significant operations or assets in, or derive significant portion of revenue or profits from Asia, and denominated in USD or other currencies including Asian currencies.
- 2. The Fund invests in emerging markets and may be subject to higher liquidity and volatility risks.

Asian Investment Grade Bonds Rebound as Yields Decline



Highlights:

- 1. Asian investment grade bonds record positive returns as a result of lower benchmark yields
- 2. Chinese high yield bonds demonstrate resilience despite risk-off sentiment
- 3. The Fund has risen 2.7% since its launch

Fund Features

- > The Fund adopts flexible allocation in Asian investment grade / high yield bonds, diversifying into different Asian countries, sectors, and currencies.
- > The Fund invests not more than 50% in Asian high yield bonds in general conditions.
- Mainly invests in corporate bonds which tend to be less sensitive to rate hike cycle.

Market Review and Outlook

Review of Interest Rate Market

- As the markets had expected, the U.S. Federal Reserve increased interest rates and raised the GDP forecast again in March. However, U.S. Treasury yields declined across the curve, as a potential trade war between the U.S. and China triggered risk-off sentiment.
- Despite a further widening of credit spreads, the Asian bond market has seen a slower correction overall in March due to declining U.S. Treasury yields.

Asian Investment Grade Bonds

- Asian investment grade bonds reversed their weak performance and recorded a positive return in March given lower benchmark yields.
- Long-end Asian sovereign and quasi-sovereign bonds recorded a decent performance due to declining U.S. Treasury yields.



Asian High Yield Bonds

- Overall Asian high yield bonds underperformed and experienced a slight correction in March due to risk-off sentiment and new supply pressure.
- Chinese high yield bonds demonstrated resilience in March, while Indian and Indonesian high yield bonds underperformed as a result of less committed investor bases and slightly longer bond durations.

Investment Strategy

- The Fund remained strategically defensive in March. It continued to trim its exposure in long-dated bonds and higher beta names, while switching into more defensive short-dated bonds.
- The Fund increased its exposure in both onshore and offshore renminbi bonds in view of the uptrend of the Chinese currency, as well as the positive news about onshore Chinese government bonds and policy bank notes being included in the Bloomberg-Barclays Global Aggregate Index starting from April 2019.
