

**Important note:**

1. ### Asian Bonds Rebound on Positive News


**Highlights:**

- 1. BBB-rated Asian bonds rebound strongly as a result of dovish comments from the U.S. Federal Reserve**
- 2. Chinese high yield industrial bonds benefit from oil price recovery**
- 3. Strong Indonesian rupiah likely to boost the country's domestic bonds**

**Fund Features**

- The Fund adopts flexible allocation in Asian investment grade / high yield bonds, diversifying into different Asian countries, sectors, and currencies.
- The Fund invests not more than 50% in Asian high yield bonds in general conditions.
- Mainly invests in corporate bonds which tend to be less sensitive to rate hike cycle.

**Market Review and Outlook**
Review of Interest Rate Market

- U.S. Treasury yields held steady in January. The U.S. Federal Reserve (Fed) reiterated its willingness to be patient on further rate adjustment.

Asian Investment Grade Bonds

- Asian credit market opened firmly at the beginning of 2019 due to dovish Fed comments, fund inflows into emerging markets and China's easing policy. Overall Asian bonds rebound strongly especially the BBB-rated names. Indonesian and Indian bonds outperformed such as quasi-sovereign and the technology, media and telecom (TMT) sector.

### Asian High Yield Bonds

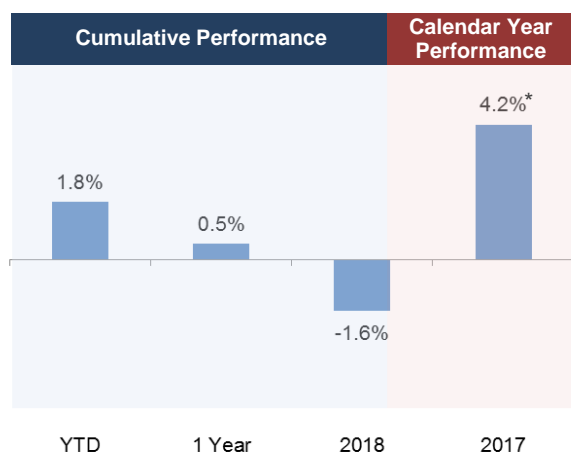
- Chinese high yield property bonds rallied alongside other sectors, but to a slightly lesser extent, due to lower average duration and continuous new supply during the month. Chinese high yield industrial names were supported by a rebound in oil prices and revaluation of lower bond prices.
- In the Southeast Asian markets, yield spreads tightened across the board. Indonesian property bonds rallied due to the stabilisation of the Indonesian rupiah and marketing sales figures.

### Investment Strategy

- The Fund maintains its neutral position in duration. We are looking to add BBB-rated laggards selectively and continue to overweight Indonesian and Indian bonds.
- We continue to prefer Indonesia's local currency bond market given the attractive carry and a likely political preference for a strong Indonesian rupiah ahead of elections in April.
- We are also positive about China's onshore bond market as the People's Bank of China is expected to launch more easing measures to support the economy.
