

Important note:

1. BEA Union Investment China High Yield Income Fund (the "Fund") seeks to achieve medium to long term capital growth and regular income by primarily (i.e. at least 70% of its net asset value) investing in high yield debt securities that are issued or guaranteed by entities which are incorporated in China or have significant operations in or assets in, or derive significant portion of revenue or profits from China.
2. The Fund is subject to general investment risk, China market concentration risk, emerging market risk and currency risk.

Interest Rate Market

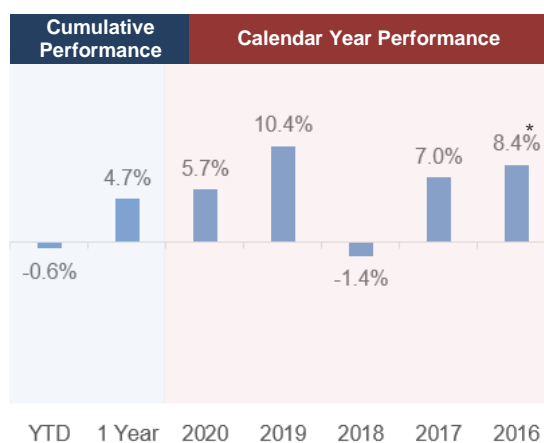
- In February, the U.S. Treasury yields continued to shoot up. The 10-year U.S. Treasury yield traded in a range between 1.08% and 1.4%. Curve has continued the steepening trend on normalization and more fiscal stimulus.

Chinese High Yield Bonds

- Market continued to be affected by the sharp rise in treasury yield during the month due to surging commodity price and the higher inflation.
- Spreads between Chinese high yield and global high yield remained high.
- Chinese property bond posted weak return on the back of the policy tightening in first half of the year. It may continue to create some volatility to the market.

Investment Strategy

- The Fund increased allocation to commodity sector, and trimmed names with credit concern.
- The Fund will focus more on credit selection and reduce names with high credit risk amid an onshore tightening cycle.
