

Important note:

1. Highlights:

1. The Fund remains overweight in equities and adds into China and Hong Kong consumer stocks
2. Selectively invest in Australian equities, prefer companies with high quality earnings, recurrent income and sustainable dividends
3. The Fund is looking to take profit or switch opportunistically in Asian investment grade bonds

Fund Features

- The Fund is an Asia Pacific equity-biased mixed-asset income fund, which invests in a prudent selection of blue-chip stocks with stable earnings and dividend growth potential.
- The Fund captures Asia Pacific blue chips’ appreciation potential using a strategy of lower volatility, it employs flexible allocation in Asia Pacific bonds to enhance returns and diversify portfolio risks.

Market Review and Outlook

Equities

- China’s onshore and offshore equity markets continued to move up in April. The markets started off with solid momentum but gradually faded after the politburo meeting signaled less easing than before.
- Australian equities continued to trend up but underperformed the region in April, led by the consumer sector on better than expected earnings and industry updates. We remain very selective in Australia and prefer companies with high quality earnings, recurrent income and sustainable dividends, and global leadership.

- Hong Kong equity market continued its upward trend in April. The banks in Hong Kong outperformed due to stronger HIBOR, while local property developers underperformed. The Macau gaming sector outperformed on better than expected earnings.
- Taiwan stock market continued the strong year-to-date rally amid expectations of semiconductor inventory correction to end by mid-year.

Bonds

- In terms of Asian investment grade bonds, valuations have come to a fair level and further upside is limited. However there is no imminent catalyst for substantial sell-off given new supply still limited.
- In April, Asian high yield credit market remained stable overall. Chinese industrial, Indian corporates and Macau gaming sectors were top performing, where we see moderate spread tightening driven by the demand from diversification.
- We expect the recent tensions in trade dispute and mixed economic data will affect overall risk sentiment and add volatility to the market.

Investment Strategy

Equities

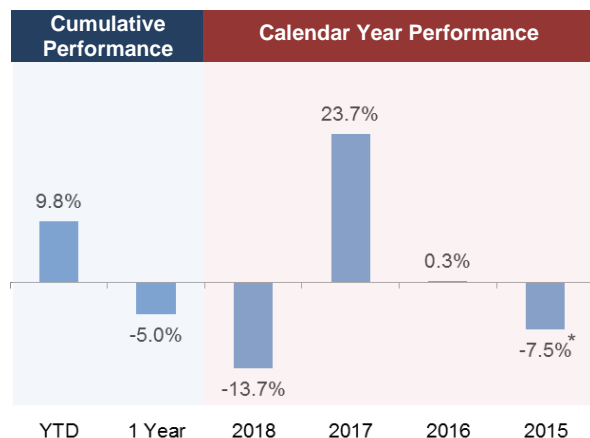
- The Fund remains overweight in equities; it has increased its allocation in equities via New Zealand, Indonesia and Taiwan.
- The Fund added mainly into consumer sectors in China, Hong Kong and New Zealand, while took profit from Australian materials and Chinese IT sectors.
- We remain cautiously constructive and mindful of a softer global growth outlook and continued uncertainty around the U.S.- China trade negotiations.

Bonds

- In terms of Asian investment grade bonds, the Fund continues to overweight selective BBB-rated names and long-end bonds with sound technical factors. At the same time, we are looking to take profit or switch opportunistically.
- In terms of Asian high yield bonds, as certain sectors were impacted by the increase in bond issuance following the reporting period, we expect investors will turn more conservative, solid names with moderate duration and higher yield pickup will likely to outperform.
