### Switch Opportunistically in Asian Investment Grade Bonds



#### Highlights:

1. Moderate spread tightening in Asian high yield bonds driven by diversification demand
2. The Fund is looking to take profit or switch opportunistically in Asian investment grade bonds
3. We remain positive on bond-proxy names, REITs and companies with a commitment to dividends

#### Fund Features

- The Fund focuses on high yielding Asia Pacific bonds and equities, distributions from both bonds and equities are the main source of income.

#### Market Review and Outlook

##### Bonds

- The market has priced in a lower possibility of rate cut by the end of 2019 following the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meeting. The U.S. Treasury yields went up slightly due to the less than dovish tone from the Federal Reserve (Fed) and a series of solid economic data.
- In April, Asian high yield credit market remained stable overall. Chinese industrial, Indian corporates and Macau gaming sectors were top performing, where we see moderate spread tightening driven by the demand from diversification.
- In terms of Asian investment grade bonds, valuations have come to a fair level and further upside is limited. However there is no imminent catalyst for substantial sell-off given new supply still limited.

### Equities

- China's onshore and offshore equity markets continued to move up in April. The markets started off with solid momentum but gradually faded after the politburo meeting signaled less easing than before. Taiwan stock market continued the strong year-to-date rally amid expectations of semiconductor inventory correction to end by mid-year.
- Singapore's equity market was strong in April mainly due to positive earnings results announced by the companies. We expect moderating GDP growth in ASEAN countries, slower global growth momentum and continued trade tension will weigh on investor sentiment.
- Australian equities continued to trend up but underperformed the region in April, led by the consumer sector on better than expected earnings and industry updates. We remain very selective in Australia and prefer companies with high quality earnings, recurrent income and sustainable dividends, and global leadership.

### Investment Strategy

#### Bonds


- In terms of Asian investment grade bonds, the Fund continues to overweight selective BBB-rated names and long-end bonds with sound technical factors. At the same time, we are looking to take profit or switch opportunistically.
- In terms of Asian high yield bonds, The Fund slightly reduced higher beta names and longer duration tranches in the Chinese property sector. The Fund also increased allocation to Asian high yield non-property sectors for diversification purpose.

#### Equities

- The Fund took profit on outperforming stocks and switched into those with attractive dividend yields.
- The Fund continues to position into higher yielding names in Singapore, Hong Kong and Australia. We remain positive on bond-proxy names, REITs and companies with a commitment to dividends backed by strong cash flow and balance sheet.
- Given the market momentum, the Fund will tactically consider the laggards with decent yields in order to enhance return.
