

Fund Monthly Report

Important note:

- 1. BEA Union Investment China Gateway Fund (the "Fund") seeks medium to long term capital growth and income through investing primarily in equity securities and/or debt securities, that are either (a) traded in China or (b) issued by entities incorporated in China or entities which have significant operations in or assets in, or derive significant portion of revenue or profits from China.
- 2. The Fund's investments are concentrated in China and may be subject to high concentration risk and more volatility than that of funds having a more diverse portfolio of investment. The value of the Fund may be more susceptible to adverse economic, political, policy, foreign exchange, liquidity, tax, legal or regulatory event affecting the China market.
- 3. The Fund invests in debts or fixed income securities are exposed to interest rates, credit/counterparty, downgrading, volatility and liquidity, valuation and sovereign debt, credit rating risks and credit rating agency risk (for mainland China onshore debt securities) which may adversely affect the price of the debt securities.

The Fund may invest in China A-Shares via Stock Connects, China interbank bond market via Foreign Direct Access Regime and/or Bond Connect which are subject to regulatory risks and various risks such as quota limitation (for Stock Connects), volatility risk, liquidity risk, settlement and counterparty risk. Change in the relevant rules and regulations may have potential retrospective effect. When there is suspension in trading, the Fund's ability to invest in the China market may be adversely affected.

Chinese Property Stocks Outperform on Policy Easing Expectations



Highlights:

- 1. Chinese property stocks outperform on policy easing expectations

Market Review and Outlook

Equities

- In February, the Chinese onshore market dropped after the Chinese New Year holidays. The economic impact of the coronavirus outbreak was reflected in the recent purchasing managers index.
- The Chinese government introduced supportive policies to encourage work resumptions, credit lending and infrastructure investments. Healthcare stocks outperformed the most during the epidemic, Chinese property stocks also outperformed due to policy easing expectations.





- Hong Kong stock market also went down in February. Macau gaming stocks underperformed as a result of temporary closure of casino, while healthcare, banking and consumer staples held up relatively well.

Bonds

- At the beginning of February, Chinese high yield bonds rebounded from the sell-off in January with the expectation on policy support from the Chinese government and well control of new infection cases.
- In terms of sectors, Chinese high yield property and industrial names outperformed because the People's Bank of China cut the loan prime rate and rolled out supportive measures for industries.

Investment Strategy

Equities

- The Fund has trimmed electric vehicle stocks and IT names for profit-taking. We have added selective healthcare names which could benefit from the increasing expenditure on healthcare infrastructure.
- The Fund continues to reserve cash to shelter from the short-term market risk. We will look to add quality names with secular growth trend.
- Overall, we continue to overweight the sectors with specific structural growth theme, including mass-market consumption, healthcare, solar energy and technology.

Bonds

- We remain cautious on global economic development amid coronavirus outbreak and OPEC disagreement. We will continue to look for solid names with exceptionally low valuations that are set to benefit from global monetary easing.
- At the same time, the Fund continues to look for opportunities to pick up names with attractive valuation and continue to diversify across sectors.
